

CONFIDENTIAL ANTHROPOLOGY REPORT Presented.

9.2 Pastoral update – presented by Michael Cawthorne (MC)

MC gave verbal update on work completed:

- Turkey Bore Homeland Impact Assessment report for a holding paddock;
- Arranged cultural monitoring for the holding yard near Balfour's Well Homeland
- Consulted with Traditional Owners regarding Pastoral Unit relocating holding yards near McCaul's Bore and Tjaa Tjaa Homeland.

He went on to explain in detail the impact assessments to these areas with the help of maps he displayed on the screen to Executive Board.

MC left meeting at 3.15pm.

9.3 SA Housing proposal to replace 2 houses as Mimili

CJ advised that SA Housing wants to replace 2 houses at Mimili. She displayed a map of Mimili on screen and indicated the houses to be replaced. They are all within existing fence line.

The APY Executive Board approve the replacement of 2 houses in Mimili by SA Housing.

9.4 SAPOL Police Hub on APY lands. – presented by Adam Rice (AR) from SA Police.

AR displayed on screen details of proposed Police stations and accommodation facilities at Kaltjiti, Pipalyatjara and Iwantja.

JC asked if this included a Women's shelter. AR said that Women's shelter would be at Umuwa through another agency.

GL asked about whether people in community drinking and fighting – bringing in grog – will they have lock up for safety. AR said we don't have those facilities now, so we would take them out of community – same as now.

GL need to work out how to keep people safe and for people to 'dry out.' AR said we do have some holding cells at Amata. Some sites do have cells.

GL said we need to tell government to have place for vulnerable people. Anangu have to look after their own people.

MM spoke about alcohol problems in her community. About people making money out of people with already damaged brains. It is a worry for her.

GL said we should pass a resolution that the Police Commissioner come for face to face with Anangu.

RKg said you can ask me to write a letter to the Police Commissioner inviting him to visit APY lands.

OB spoke about the problems with young people in Adelaide. We should be looking after those people too.

OB asked about the leases. RKg said they will all be on a lease, but not big money.

AR displayed the slide and outlined the next steps.

He then went on to explain the timeline for this project.

- Offsite Construction of facilities from April 2021.
- Site preparation works progressing July 2021.

- Commence delivery to sites August/Sept 2021
- Site Installation Oct / Nov 2021
- Handover of all sites complete by early first quarter 2022.

The APY Executive Board have reviewed the plans for SAPOL police hub and direct CLHU to commence consultations using the plans provided by SAPOL.

2.7 Letter from Hon Dan van Holst Pellekaan MP, SA Minister for Energy and Mining.

RKg advised that Minister has granted Rio Tinto an exploration licence. It is now necessary for CLHU to consult with nguritja. They provided a map and the area is located in the APY lands approximately 280km northwest of Marla and covers an area of 810km². If APY grants permission to Rio Tinto for exploration the DEM would grant licence under the Mining Act 1971 with conditions set out in the attachment 3 to his letter and invites submissions related to licence conditions in accordance with section 21(3) of the Act.

The APY Executive Board give approval for Anthropology to start consultation with Traditional Owners of the proposed Rio Tinto Exploration area ELA2017/00202 located in APY lands and bring back EBA impact assessment.

2.10 Update from Dept. of Energy – Lynda Curtis

Cowell Electric need to install the new meters soon as possible as the existing meters are old and need upgrading. This does not mean charging for electricity is starting now, charging is a separate activity.

Representatives from State Government will attend the next APY Lands Executive Board meeting to explain the next steps of charging for electricity, which is currently scheduled to commence 1 July

BS spoke about the need for more consultation around the hardship for people.

GL said we need a top person from government to attend meeting.

BS agreed we need someone from high rank to talk to the community.
