People entering the Designated Areas, (Remote Communities) regardless of the reason, <u>MUST meet ALL of</u> <u>these minimum requirements</u> (Entry Criteria) and be prepared to sign or verbalise a declaration that they have done so.

The intent is to ensure (as much as possible) the person is not infected with coronavirus disease.

- The declaration can also be obtained verbally and without a signature by answering the questions on this page.
- It is only an 'individual' (or the accompanying adult in the case of a dependent child) who can verify to their own health status. An organisation or family member/friend cannot complete the form on behalf of the person applying to enter.
- This Form (or equivalent verification) must be completed immediately prior to entry (the day of) and a record may be retained by your employer and/or the local decision-maker.
- You will need to provide other information such as the reason for entering the Designated Area and
